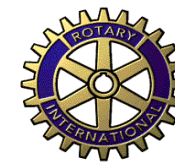

BLOOD PRESSURE AWARENESS DAY

A normal blood pressure is around 140/90. There is no way of knowing if you have high blood pressure, apart from having it measured. Around 80% of men and 40% of women with high blood pressure are not being treated.

A stroke occurs when the blood supply is disrupted, and parts of the brain can become damaged or destroyed. Some strokes are fatal, while others can cause paralysis and/or communication problems.

Nurses will be testing the blood pressure of members of the public during the day, and Rotarians from Novus, de Montfort and our own Club will be on hand to encourage shoppers to take part. If you would like to help, and can spare a couple of hours between 10.00 am and 3.00 pm, please let me know as soon as possible so that a rota can be organised. Thank you.
