

Tolstoy, the author and great pacifist, was once lecturing on the need to be non-resistant and non-violent towards all creatures. Someone in the audience responded by asking what should be done if one was attacked in the woods by a tiger.

Other notable achievements this year include:

- Transitioning to an online meeting model allowing us to entertain guests and speakers from far flung corners of the world including South Africa, Ivory Coast, Bordeaux and Delhi.
- Scott and Diana conceived and led our Christmas hampers and Easter eggs appeals which were very successful.
- Membership remained steady with an increase expected in the next 12 months my thanks go to
 Nick Thomson for his excellent work in this respect.
- We created the Universities of Leicester Rotaract club with 22 members.
- Diana Esho has initiated an exciting sensory garden project at Netherhall school which will progress through next year.
- We donated mobile phones and tablets which went to local as well as Indian school children.
- We took steps towards twinning our club with the Rotary Club of Bordeaux Ouest in France.
- Several Rotarians helped at Covid centres at not inconsiderable risk to themselves.
- Simon Gravett set up a popular new online bridge evening as well as running the popular annual golf AMAM.
- Chris Saul secured a talented young RYLA candidate.
- Moira Bartlett did a great job with young writer.
- Tarratt Pin, awarded by the President to the person who has helped him the most in the year, went to Babs Marsden—will done Babs.

 The Hon Secretary awarded the bottle of port to the member giving the best (in the Secretary's opinion) vote of thanks to Tim Lee. Tim gave the VoT when our speaker was Steve Howe who told us all about raising, training and grooming a show dog.

Of course, I would have failed miserably were it not for the support of my fellow Rotarians. Richard Power did a fabulous job keeping our spirits up with his regular Covid related updates. I also offer thanks to past presidents Brian Groves, Paul Bonnett, Patrick Boylan and Rodney Spokes for meeting with me and offering their invaluable guidance. And last but not least, I thank all of the members for your generous donations and support.

As life begins returning to normal, I wish Scott Gallacher all the best in his year as President, and with Nick Thomson and then Tara Pankhania to follow, I feel confident that the club is in excellent hands for the foreseeable future.
